

## SUPPORTING BERKELEY MOSHAV



Bay Area Jewish life is becoming even more vibrant, as Berkeley Moshav embarks on development of the

first Jewish cohousing community in the U.S. Our \$4 million **Jewish Organization loan** allowed the group to purchase a site and move the project forward.

This loan was made possible through a partnership with the Jewish Community Federation and Endowment Fund, which made a one-time recoverable grant (a loan) of \$4 million to Hebrew Free Loan, to support Jewish organizations.



Cohousing integrates private homes and shared common spaces to foster connectedness and community.

## ASSISTING STUDENTS THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY

In partnership with local agencies, we provide student loans on a nonsectarian basis to help young people from lower income homes get a college education. The **Pollak Community Loan Program** is supported entirely by funds that donors contribute for this purpose.

**In FY 2019-20, we disbursed \$11,647,421 in new loans.** These disbursements are not considered expenses because, as outstanding loans, they remain assets of the agency. The combination of these loan disbursements, plus \$711,071 in direct program expenses, total \$12,358,492. Thus, 93% of all outgoing funds were expended for program activities. The remaining 7% went to supporting services.


