


#### **Our Debt Consolidation loans offer hope and relief**



# Recycling Loans Creates Impact Over Generations

Every dollar is recycled many times over, so the impact of each donation grows exponentially. In 1990, when we started tracking loans by computer, we had just \$4M in assets. Since then, we've given out \$129M in interest-free loans.
